BRIEF HISTORY



The Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital was started in 12.04.1970 as a 50 bedded hospital which was extended up to 500 beds in 1987. Emergency services were started in 1987 for day time only and with effect from April, 1988 it became functional round the clock. In 2008, trauma block was commissioned which increased the bed strength to 640; emergency services shifted to this new block with expanded emergency room and wards. Hospital has expanded to 41 Paediatric Intensive Care units which includes 25 bedded Neonatal ICU-cum-Nursery, 08 bedded Out Born Nursery (OBN) as well as Paediatrics ICU (PICU) each. The functional Bed Strength of DDUH is now 648.

Apart from routine OPD facility, facility of Special Clinics such as De-addiction clinic, Breast Clinic, CTEV, Vascular and Diabetic foot clinic, Tumours Clinic, Deafness Clinic/ Vertigo, Rhinology Clinic, Harniya Clinic, Asthma Clinic and Sunday Clinic (for Sr. Citizen Med.) along with the OPD facility under AYUSH for Ayurveda and Homeopathy, are also being provided in DDUH.

This hospital is one of the largest facilities providing hospital with specialized services and inpatient care to people of West Delhi. It is a referral central for peripheral hospital like Guru Gobind Singh Hospital, Shri Dada Dev Matri Avum Shishu Chikitsalya, Rao Tula Ram Memorial Hospital, CGHS Dispensaries, ABGH, Sardar Vallab Bhai Patel Hospital and various private hospitals of West Delhi. It also imparts training to various Post graduate and under graduate medical students and Para-medical students. The Hospital has PM-Jan Aushadhi Kendra in its premises which provides medicines to the patients at cheaper rates. In the process of digitization of records, various reports are being uploaded on the HMIS Portal on monthly/daily basis by the hospital. The hospital has successfully transitioned to the NextGen e-Hospital Portal for generation of all the OPD and Emergency registration cards. Play area in the Paediatrics OPD has been started.

In its continuous journey of improvement, many infrastructural revamps and renovations have been carried out in various Wards and Departments of the hospital to make these well equipped with updated technology and machines to provide quality care.

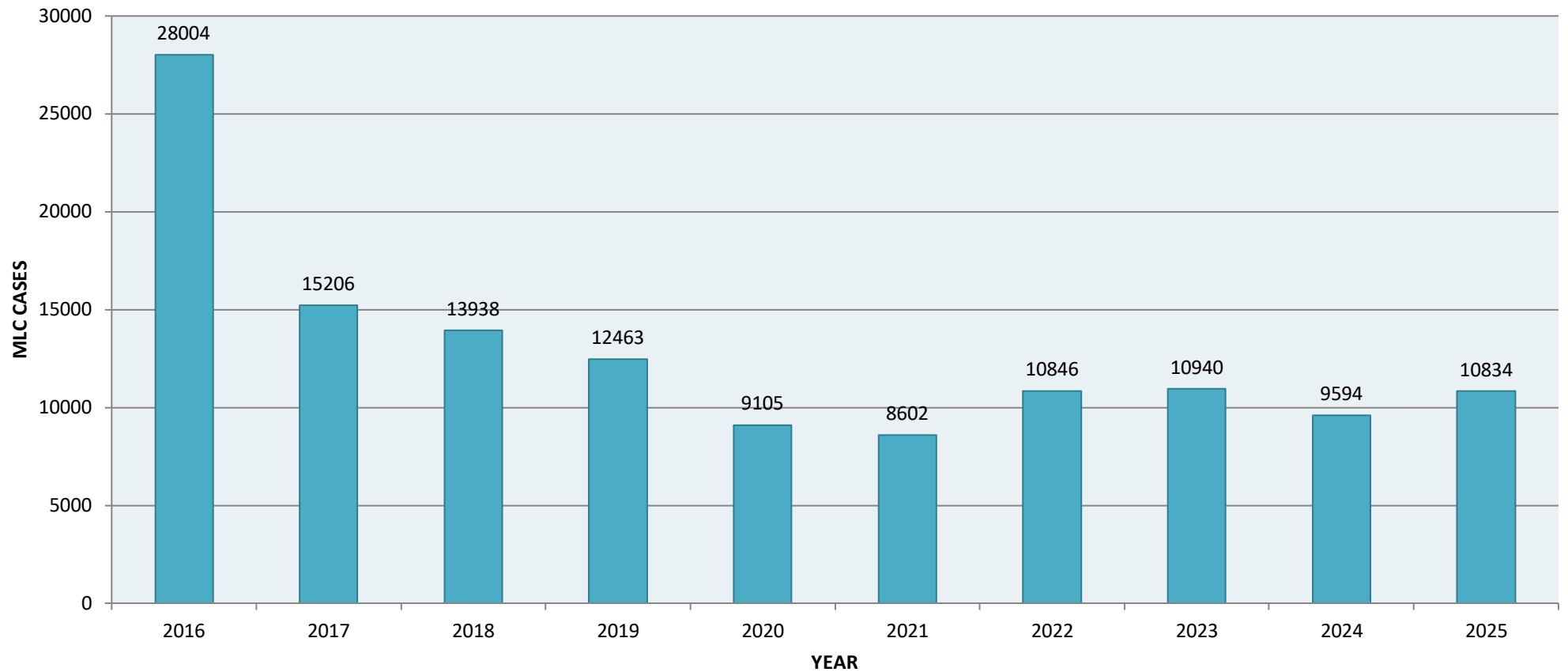
OPD ATTENDANCE IN DDUH DURING THE LAST DECADE



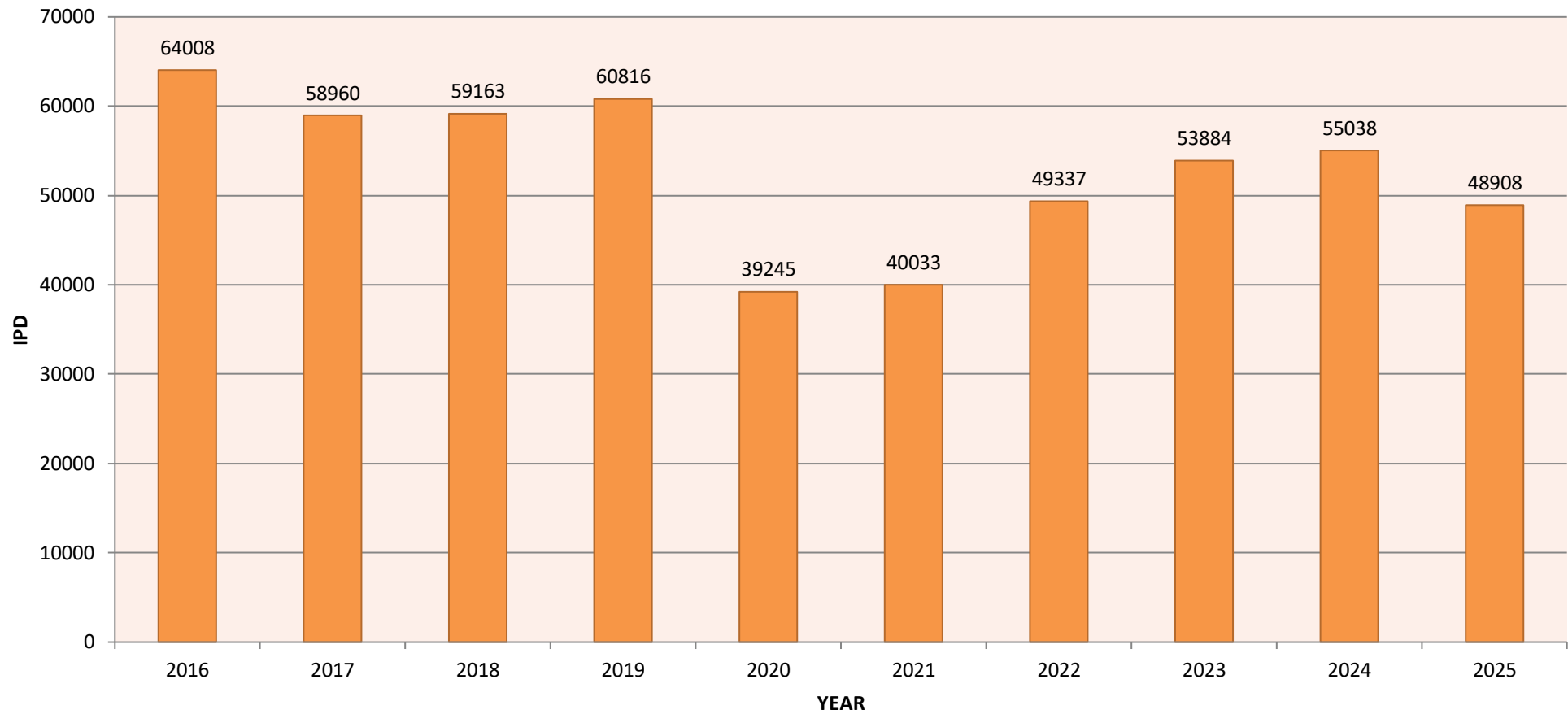
EMERGENCY ATTENDANCE IN DDUH DURING LAST DECADE



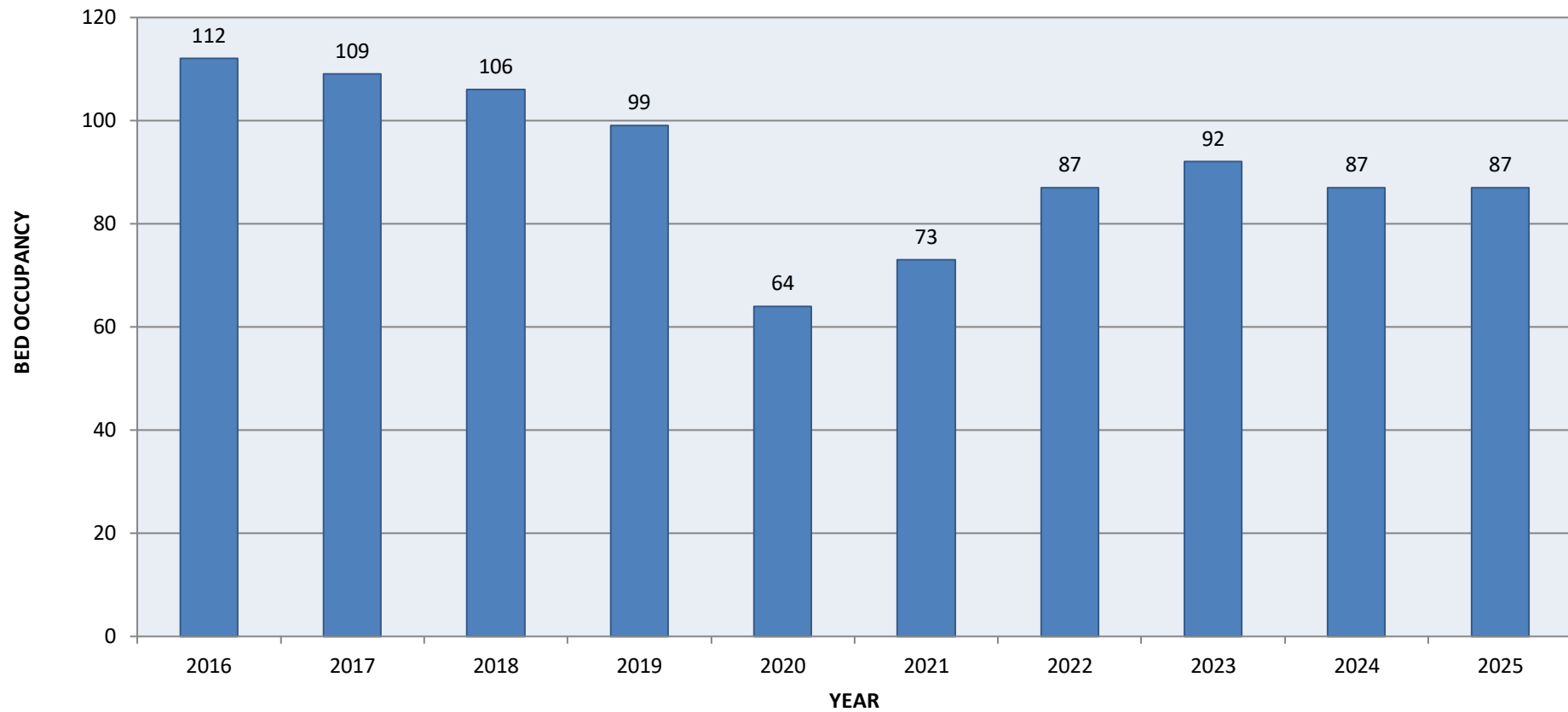
MLC CASES IN DDUH DURING THE LAST DECADE



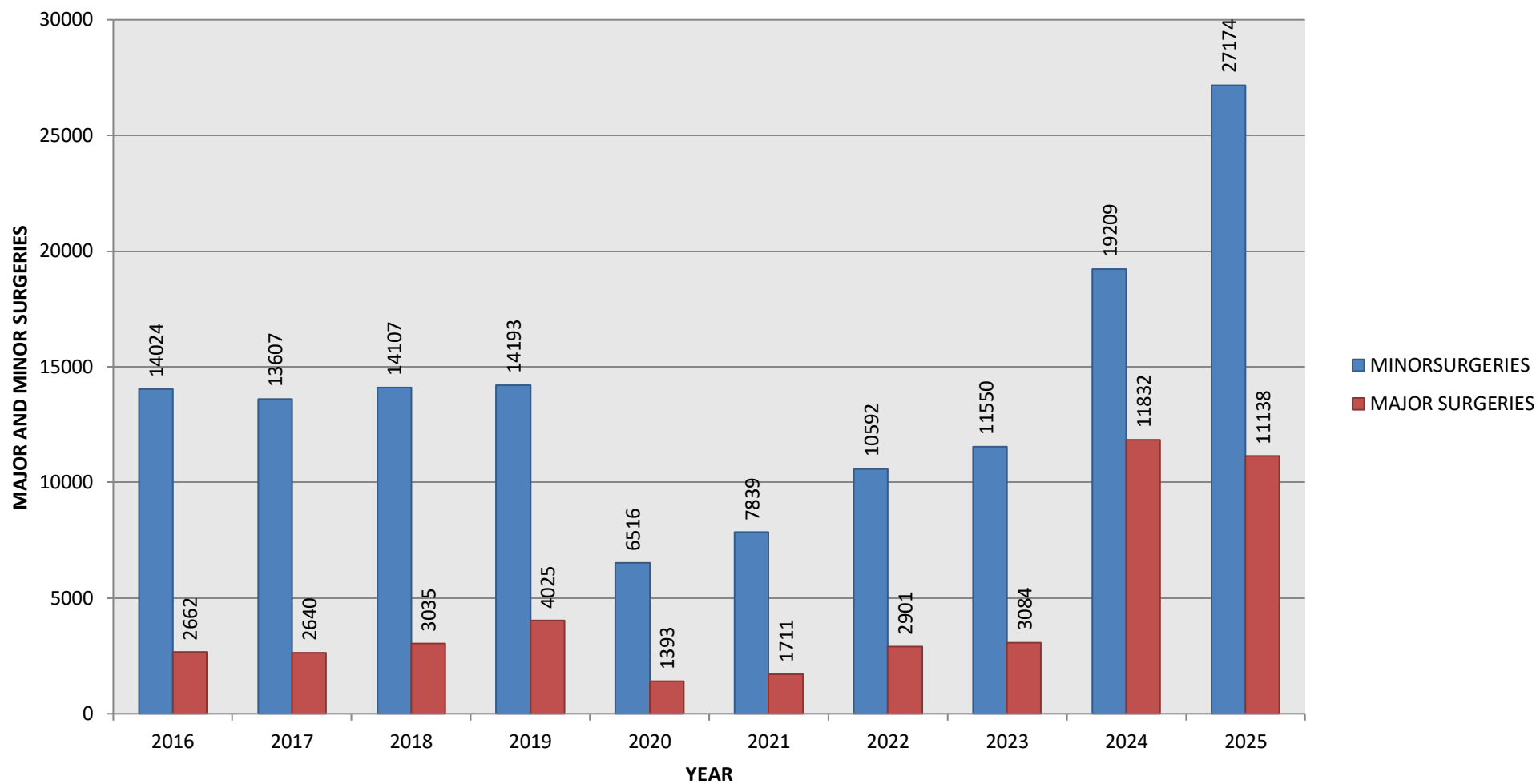
IPD ATTENDANCE IN DDUH DURING THE LAST DECADE



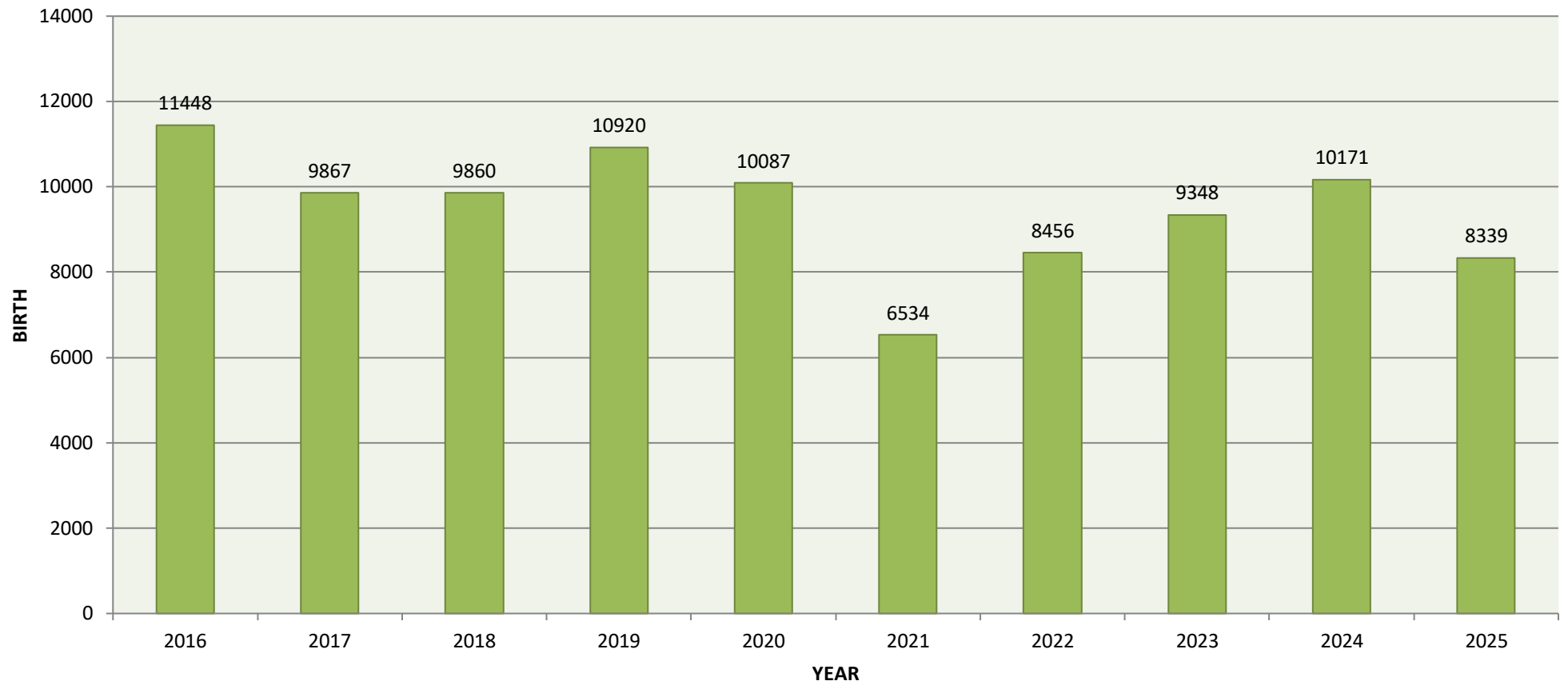
BED OCCUPANCY IN DDUH DURING THE LAST DECADE

DEPARTMENT OF OPHTHALMOLOGY

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The department of Ophthalmology, DDU Hospital is presently being headed by Dr. Amit Mehtani supported by 3 other consultants. The department is running daily OPD from Monday to Saturday along with special clinics such as Glaucoma clinic, Retina clinic, Squint clinic etc. in the afternoons. The eye ward is presently housed on 3rd floor, Trauma block and comprises of 35 beds.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE:

1. The Department provides comprehensive eye care on Out patient basis (Daily OPD from Monday to Saturday) using state of art equipment. Special Clinics like Glaucoma Clinic, Retina clinic, Strabismus clinic are also being done in the afternoons.
2. Refractions are being performed and corrective spectacles are being prescribed.
3. Management of cataract cases with phaco emulsification surgery and intra-ocular lenses is being done. Yag capsulotomies are being done.
4. Glaucoma workup and surgeries- Glaucoma workup using Applanation tonometry, OCT, UBM, Laser peripheral iridotomy, gonioscopy, visual fields (perimetry).
5. Strabismus and Neuro ophthalmology work up and management of Squint cases.
6. Oculoplastic surgeries.
7. Retinal disorders and treatment wherever possible, diagnosis and treatment using FFA, OCT, green laser, fundus photography.. Anti VEGF Injection of Intravitreal Ranibizumab for treatment of macular oedema and Neovascularization of Retina.
9. Lacrimal sac procedures like syringing, Probing, DCT, DCR.
10. Retinopathy of prematurity screening and referral to a tertiary care center where required.
11. Ophthalmic emergency services 24x7.
12. Eye bank facilities – retrieval of donor corneas being done round the clock.
13. DNB teaching activities: classes being conducted on Wednesday (1-3 pm) and Saturday (9-10 pm) through seminars, lectures, case presentation etc.
14. DNB exam (Practical) and FAT exams are being conducted.

DEPARTMENT OF RADIOLOGY

INTRODUCTION-

Radiology Department provides Radiological Services like Digital X-rays, C.T. Scan and Ultrasound to all patients of OPD, IPD and Emergency round the clock 24*7 as well as OPD patients. Radiology Department also provides all these services to Medico Legal cases (MLC), patients referred from Tihar Jail and other peripheral hospitals and dispensaries.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE DEPARTMENT

X-RAY

1. Digital X-Ray Facility for the OPD, IPD and Emergency and all MLC Patients.
2. Special investigations X-Rays: IVP, Barium studies, HSG, RGU-MCU, Sinogram etc. Are not done at present in the department due to non availability of DFR
3. Bed side X-Ray facility is also provided to sick admitted patients.

ULTRASOUND

- The department provides all type of Ultrasound Facility to all Emergency, IPD and OPD Patients including antenatal ultrasound of pregnant patients.
- Special Ultrasonological procedures- Ultrasound Guided FNAC, Colour Doppler, drainage of liver abscess etc. are also done in the department. Diagnostic & therapeutic aspirations – pleural, peritoneal etc.

C.T. SCAN

1. The department provides all type of C.T. Scan facility – OPD, IPD, Emergency and MLC patients.
2. Special C.T. Scan procedures like High Resolution C.T. Scans are also done in the department.

DEPARTMENT OF PATHOLOGY AND LAB MEDICINE

The Department has an extended test menu which includes routine and special investigations of Hematology, Biochemistry, Cytology, Histopathology, Immunoassays, Clinical Pathology and a 24 hrs emergency lab services.

All samples are processed within time in spite of severe staff constraints.

Quality control tools are implemented at all levels and Guidelines of NQAS and KAYAKALP are being implemented. All relevant sections of the Lab participate in External Quality Assurance Programs.

Academic activities are being conducted periodically so that all lab doctors and staff can keep upgrading their knowledge. Departmental seminars are frequently being conducted.

The lab has a very important role to play in ongoing researches as most projects involve lab investigations. A number of DNB theses have been completed with the support and co-guidance of our specialists.

Regular training program of all categories of healthcare professionals and students is being conducted, which includes MLT, MSc, BSc, MBBS Interns and Residents under District Residency program.

Specialist doctors are involved in teaching of B.Sc Nursing students of Pannadai College of Nursing.

On the occasion of World Thalassemia Day on 8th may 2025, the Department organized a CME on Thalassemia awareness where the doctors and staff of the hospital were educated about importance of early Thalassemia diagnosis especially in children and antenatal women. (Photographs enclosed).

The Department organized a program based on "Swasth Naari Shashakt Parivar Abhiyan" in September 2025 making the general public aware of importance of Anaemia and Thalassemia in Antenatal patients and young women (Photographs enclosed).

Our doctors frequently participate in annual conferences which is a way of self-improvement and projection of departmental work..

The department actively participates in national and state level programs eg. Cancer Control Program, Thalassemia Screening.

The Department plans to procure a new Upgraded immunoassay analyzer to provide uninterrupted services for Hormones, Vitamins and tumour marker tests in patient interest.

The Department is planning to undergo renovation of the lab areas and initiate implementation of Lab Information management System (LIMS) in Coordination with Hospital Information Management System (HIMS).

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

The Department of Clinical Microbiology and Infectious Diseases provide laboratory test services to all OPD and admitted patients of Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital. It also caters to patients referred from other health care centers of Delhi as well as walk in clients for HIV testing.

The staff comprises of highly trained Clinical Microbiologists, Residents, Infection Control Nurses, Technical officer, Medical Lab technologists, Counsellors, Nursing Orderlies, Peons and Safai Karamcharis.

(B) Facilities Available:

1. Aerobic Bacterial Culture and Identification Tests

Automated blood culture system for monitoring blood samples in special bottles to rapidly detect bacteria causing bloodstream infections. Urine, Cerebrospinal Fluid, Pus and Wound swabs, Respiratory Secretions, Sputum / Throat swabs, Other Sterile body fluid (Pleural / Synovial / Ascitic/Pericardial/ Vitreous etc.), Catheters / Endotracheal Tubes, High Vaginal swabs, Eye/Ear/ Nasal / Oral, conjunctival, umbilical swabs

2. Antibiotic Sensitivity Tests-

Disc diffusion tests, strip MIC, ESBL detection, MRSA detection

3. Serology

Widal/Typhidot, RPR, Hepatitis B & C, HIV in ICTC, Dengue IgM & NS1, Chikungunya IgM.

4. Microscopy

Gram's Stain directly from specimens, & culture material, ZN Stain for AFB (M. tuberculosis & M. leprae in SSS) except sputum, KOH mount for fungus, Hanging Drop for Vibrio cholera in stool, Modified AFB staining for Cryptosporidium spp. etc., India Ink for Cryptococcus in CSF and Albert's stain for C. diphtheriae, Stool routine and Microscopy

5. Hospital infection Surveillance

Air surveillance of critical areas (OT& ICU, NICU), Sterility test of blood bags for bacteria & fungi, Sterility test of dialysis fluid & IV fluids for bacteria & fungi, In use testing of disinfectants and Environmental samples.

DEPARTMENT OF ANAESTHESIA

- Dept. of Anaesthesia has been successfully and smoothly managing many vital areas of the hospital including 06 Elective and 03 Emergency OTs, Pre Anaesthetic Checkup (PAC) clinic, Pain clinic, Intensive care unit (ICU), Medical Gas Pipeline System (MGPS) and CSSD.
- A vast number of surgeries which required anaesthesia and perioperative anaesthesia care were performed under Surgery, Plastic surgery, Obs and Gynae, Orthopedics, ENT, Ophthalmology both in elective and emergency OTs.
- A total of 20730 PACs of patients were done from Jan- Dec 2025. In order to improve the quality of Pre Anaesthetic Checkup (PAC) and minimize the cancellation of cases, all PACs are now being done under the direct supervision and presence of senior faculty members.
- 02 faculty members- Dr Beldar Sharad Raghunath and Dr Anjali were newly inducted in the Dept.
- The Department is regularly conducting DNB practical examinations and is a Centre for DNB Examinations for the past many years.
- The Department successfully conducted various activities during the **Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Awareness week from 13th to 17th October**. A total of 400 medical and paramedical staff including doctors, nursing staff, administrative staff, security personnel and Nursing orderlies of the hospital were provided Basic Life Support (BLS) training during this period. Mass demonstration with training and awareness was organized for general public through Nukkad Natak. Training was also organized for school children.
- BLS training was also provided to new technical trainees and nursing staff.
- The Department has been actively participating in the disaster mock drills regularly conducted in the hospital and manages the CODE BLUE Team of the hospital.
- PAC clinic was also equipped with multipara monitors for better monitoring of patients.

DEPARTMENT OF ACCIDENT & EMERGENCY

The Department of Accident & Emergency has continued to play a vital role in providing round-the-clock emergency medical services while strengthening digital systems, disaster preparedness, public health awareness, and medico-legal services during the year 2025.

During the reporting period, the department successfully transitioned from conventional offline medico-legal case (MLC) documentation maintained in physical registers to an online MLC documentation system through the MedLEaPR platform. This transition has significantly improved documentation accuracy, traceability, data security, and medico-legal compliance while reducing manual errors and enhancing coordination with law enforcement agencies.

The department actively contributed towards community capacity building by conducting Basic Life Support (BLS) training and disaster safety awareness sessions for the general public. These training programs aimed to improve early emergency response by bystanders and enhance community preparedness during medical emergencies and disaster situations.

The department also played an important role in disaster preparedness activities by successfully conducting and participating in mock drill exercises conducted during Operation Sindoor, ensuring readiness for mass casualty incidents and surge emergency situations.

- * Transitioned from conventional offline medico-legal case (MLC) register documentation to online MLC documentation through MedLEaPR platform, improving documentation accuracy, traceability, and medico-legal compliance.
- * Conducted Basic Life Support (BLS) training and disaster safety awareness sessions for the general public, contributing to community emergency preparedness and early life-saving response.
- * Successfully conducted and participated in Mock Drill during Operation Sindoor, ensuring preparedness for mass casualty and emergency surge situations.
- * Organized and executed Fire Safety Drills and Multi-Disaster Preparedness Drills within the hospital premises, with active casualty department involvement in triage, stabilization, and emergency patient management.
- * Conducted Patient Education and Awareness Sessions on Rabies Prevention, focusing on early reporting, wound care, and vaccination awareness.
- * Implemented NextGen platform for patient treatment workflow, improving digital patient management, documentation efficiency, and treatment continuity.

In addition, multiple fire safety drills and multi-disaster preparedness drills were organized within the hospital premises with active involvement of the casualty team.

The department efficiently managed triage, stabilization, and emergency handling protocols during these drills, strengthening institutional emergency response mechanisms.

As part of public health outreach, the department conducted patient education and awareness sessions focusing on Rabies prevention, emphasizing early wound care, timely vaccination, and importance of immediate medical consultation following animal bites.

Further strengthening digital healthcare delivery, the department implemented the NextGen platform for patient treatment workflow, improving digital patient record maintenance, treatment documentation, and continuity of care across departments.

The Department of Accident & Emergency continues to remain committed to providing high-quality emergency medical care, strengthening medico-legal services, enhancing disaster preparedness, promoting public health awareness, and adopting digital healthcare solutions for improved patient care delivery.

DEPARTMENT OF ENT

DEPARTMENT OF BLOOD BANK

Department of Blood Bank has collected 15681 units of blood in the period from January 2025 to December 2025, out of which 1538 Blood donations were from 35 camps and in- house voluntary collection. Autologous Donations are also encouraged.

This center being the mother Blood Bank of eight Blood storage centers, catering to the Blood needs of RTRMH, GGSJ, SDDMSC ABGH, SVBPH, IGH, Cantonment Gen. Hospital, Mata Gujri Hospital besides the other Government and private hospitals.

The routine testing in Blood Group serology & Infectious marker labs are being done on fully automated system.

33801 Blood component units have been issued in this period out of which 83.01% were issued without replacement. This could be possible due to the component separation having achieved more than 99.80%. Blood Bank caters to the demand of regular Blood transfusion needs of around 500 Thalassemia cases. Having attained the professional excellence, this center has become a referral center for immuno- haematology cases including Thalassemia patients many of whom have been referred to for compatibility testing by other Blood Banks as this center has specialized in issuing antibody screened, Rh and Kell matched, leuco-reduced packed red blood cells to multiple transfusion cases.

This center has achieved 100% scoring in Blood Bank External Quality Assurance Scheme as accredited with SDMH Jaipur QCI.

Because of its continuous and qualitative participation in Donor-vigil and Haemo-vigil of Haemovigilance programme of India, Blood Bank DDU hospital was being selected for the dissertation work of PhD for M. Pharma students coming to National Institute of Biologicals under M/o Health & FW, GOI.

The Blood Centre is now equipped with NAT lab and all donors units collected are NAT tested for issue to patients. NAT testing gives an additional layer of blood safety.

A cold storage has been installed for blood inventory. The centre is now having facility of Smart Storage Device for real time blood inventory management which is RFID-Based Tracking of Blood Units. This enables real-time monitoring, accurate inventory management and prevention of mix-ups besides verification of cold-chain and storage conditions. The Blood centre has Apheresis facility also.

RBTC(WZ), Department of Blood Transfusion, Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital has been awarded as the best Blood Centre of Delhi by MOHFW, GOI in the National Conclave on Blood Transfusion Services, held on 5th-6th February 2025 at Kochi, Kerala.

The Blood Centre has been providing hands on training for LTs and Counsellor as well as DMLT students and BSc Nursing students.
